Record these in your home learning book.</p> <p>2) Generate questions that might be asked about this text. You must write at least seven questions, varying in complexity and ranging from being awarded 1 to 3 marks.</p> <p>3) Answer 4 of the questions; two 1 mark questions and two 3 mark answers. If the verb is active rewrite the sentence using a passive verb etc.</p> <p>How did you work out which was which? <p><u>Task Five</u></p> <p>Using the website suggested below, produce your own 'Parts of Speech' information leaflet. What would you like to find out? You could ask about their feelings at different points in the story, or what happened after the final events we know about.</p> <p>Make sure each letter is:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • set out correctly (address and dear...) • has an introduction • three or four paragraphs • sign off <p><u>Challenge!</u> Imagine receiving a reply from them!
