School Meals

Thank you all for your support with the trial of Live Kitchen. The trial is ongoing and we welcome any feedback you have on this. We know there have been a few issues regarding updated balances on Schoolcomms but please be assured these are hopefully now resolved. Balances on Schoolcomms should be correct daily at approximately 5pm when the two systems synchronise. We are also aware of texts being sent regarding balances. You will now receive a reminder text if your debt amounts to more than £24.50 which is two weeks' worth of meals.

If you are ordering school meals at home, please ensure you and your child order the meals together so they know what to expect when they collect their meal in the dining room.

Year 6 parents - if your child has school meals could you please ensure that the balance is cleared by Friday 20th July, and payment for any meals for the week commencing 23rd July are paid in advance. Meals cost £2.45 per day. Please contact the office in the event of a query.
