Headteacher's Message

On Monday, Tracy Warner, the Education Services Director for Primary Education at Herts for Learning visited Bowmansgreen to acknowledge the significant improvements in achievement and progress that have been taking place at Bowmansgreen. She was very complimentary about how well behaved and happy pupils are and appreciative of the hard work and commitment of staff. She commented on what a lovely school Bowmansgreen is and how much she enjoyed her visit.

Next Friday, we will be holding our first book swap event of the year. Pupils can bring the books they would like to swap to the mobile classroom from 2.45pm and choose books to take home. If you would like to attend with your child, you can visit with them once you have collected them from their classroom at the end of the school day. Please don't worry if your child does not have a book to swap - they are welcome to take a book this time and bring one to swap next time. This event has proved very popular in the past so please come along and try it out!

We have been notified by parents and local residents of an increase in the number of cars parking at the rear of the school (by the Caledon Club) and several incidences of dangerous or inconsiderate parking at the pick-up and drop-off. We appreciate that most parents are in a rush on the school run but please could I remind everyone to prioritise safety and be mindful of the pedestrians, residents and other drivers.

All pupils will experience Forest School during the year as part of the Bowmansgreen curriculum. Forest School is an approach to learning that provides opportunities to achieve and develop confidence and self-esteem through hands-on outdoor experiences. Forest School is led by Mrs Stanley and takes place four afternoons a week throughout the year. Your child will bring home a letter when it is their turn to take part.

Parent consultations take place next week, Tuesday and Thursday. Please see your child's class teacher if you have not yet booked an appointment.

You may have noticed that we have a new fence at the front of the school. The fence has been necessary to stop children and visitors walking in the road, instead of using the paths and zebra-crossings, when going to breakfast club, the school office or after school club. It does mean a slightly longer walk but a much safer one!

Early Years News

This week

This week, the children have been learning about people who help them to keep healthy e.g. doctors, nurses and dentists. We have been talking about our experiences of going to the doctor or when we have been unwell. We are beginning to write about these helpful people and also about what we did at the weekend! We continued to learn and practise our phonics. Ask your child if they can say and write the following sounds: "S" "A" "T" "P" "N". Can your child tell you what Metal Mike helps us to do?

In Maths, we have been counting upwards and backwards to 20 and matching corresponding numbers to amounts, counting carefully by moving cubes.

Next week

The children will be learning about people who help us in the community i.e., a postman, bus driver, road worker etc. We will be looking at non-fiction books and writing in speech bubbles. For Black History Month we will be learning about the inventor of the traffic light. Please can children bring in any cardboard boxes so we can make a traffic lights.
