Headteacher's Message

On Friday, the school was visited by our Herts Improvement Partner (HIP) whose role it is to work closely with the school as a critical, professional friend, helping to evaluate performance and plan with us to continue to bring about effective improvement. The HIP enjoyed a very positive visit to Bowmansgreen and she recognised the hard work, strong support and involvement of parents and the on-going improvements in the quality and effectiveness of the teaching, learning and curriculum. Our HIP agrees that Bowmansgreen provides a good education for its pupils and a rich curriculum and I continue to be very proud of the school and appreciative of the continued support that the staff and governors receive from the school and local community.

On Tuesday, PC Horwood led a workshop with KS2 pupils, discussing issues around offensive, bullying behaviour including the use of racist, homophobic, insulting and offensive language. Pupils discussed words that can be used to cause offence and why using such language can face serious consequences. We continue to reinforce and promote our school rules and values through our curriculum and expect pupils to live up to these expectations in the relationships they build with each other.

Unfortunately, one area where some of our pupils need constant reminders about how to behave and treat each other is when they are communicating online. There are frequent examples of pupils accessing inappropriate content, attempting to be unkind or use offensive language towards each other via their phones and other devices. I would urge all parents to get involved in their child's online communication and not make assumptions about its nature or content. I think some of you would be horrified at what you found! What is really positive is that other pupils are not standing for this behaviour and they are reporting and blocking inappropriate comments, content and users. I was very pleased to learn of a group of Y6 pupils who removed two individuals from a conversation when they began to use inappropriate language and one boy who reported what another pupil sent to him - they should be very proud of themselves for taking such decisive action. No pupil should have to be subject to or witness bullying or threatening behaviours in person or online and it can sometimes take a firm, collective response from their peers to make that point clear.

Next week, parent consultation meetings take place. If you haven't already done so, please ensure that you have booked an appointment to see your child's teacher to discuss their progress and achievements so far this year and have a chance to look at some of their classwork.

The school choir has been busy rehearsing for their part in Monday's Primary Festival at the Alban Arena which, this year, is based on the theme 'rainforest'. I am really looking forward to watching our fantastic choir perform with choirs from other local schools - it promises to be a great concert!

You will be pleased to know that all of our Y6 pupils have now been allocated places at local secondary schools. It has been a very frustrating and worrying time for many Bowmansgreen families and indeed lots of families across St Albans, affected by this process. Hopefully, this was an isolated situation but we will be seeking advice, information and working closely with local schools, councillors and the local authority to ensure that we are proactive and fully informed to be able to best support our current Y5 go through the secondary school application process in October.
