Headteacher's Message

On Wednesday, PCSO Debbie Daniels led a whole school assembly on road safety. She reminded pupils about how to be safe pedestrians and cyclists and about how important it is to be alert and aware around cars, including never intentionally distracting drivers. Pupils were able to demonstrate how much they had learnt about road safety from their recent home learning - I was very impressed!

During this week's full governing body meeting, school governors discussed some of the issues around pupils' online safety and how online bullying is a growing issue for today's children and young people. Staff are spending more and more time following up issues that have stemmed from conversations, gaming or the sharing of information on-line. If your child has a mobile device and they access apps and the internet independently, we urge you to check what they are accessing and who they are communicating with. We know that an increasing number of pupils hear or use foul, inappropriate or aggressive language when gaming or messaging. It is going to take a constant, joint effort from home and school to try and address this worrying trend.

Sims Lite Application

We are in the process of introducing 'Sims Lite', an application that links to our SIMS school database and enables parents/carers to make requests to amend certain information. The app will alleviate the need for you to check your data annually and help us to comply with the General Data Protection Regulations.

Requests made automatically link to our database to be authorised by the school office. The app is particularly useful if you change your phone numbers or address.

An invitation to initiate the SIMS Lite App will be sent to those who have parental responsibility, along with information on how to activate the app. You have the choice whether or not you wish to use it. Those using the app will only be able to see their own data - you will not be able to see information about other users with parental responsibility.

Price of School Meals

Hertfordshire Catering have informed us that due to the continuing impact of the living wage, other increases in staffing costs and the rising cost of food, the price of a school meal will increase from 23rd April 2019 as follows:

Weekly Cost £12.75 Daily Cost £2.55

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will continue to be free. All children can choose to either bring a packed lunch in or have a school meal on a daily basis.
