If you are finding the text too tricky to read, ask an adult to read it to you and share the book together.	Answer the following questions in full sentences. 1) What did Brer Rabbit enjoying doing? 2) How did the animals in the forest feel once Tiger and Lion moved in? Why did they feel this way? 3) What did the animals do to stay safe? (p.6) 4) How did Brer Rabbit feel? (p.6) 5) What does the word ' <b>boredom</b> ' mean? Use it in a sentence. 6) What do you know so far about Brer Rabbit?
Session 2	<b>The Tricky Rabbit</b> <i>Retold by Walt Flood</i>	Please read Chapter 2, pages <b>7 to 9</b> , independently or to an adult. Stop after page 9 and answer questions 1 to 4. Please read Chapter 3, <b>page 10 to 11</b> . Answer question 5 and 6. If you are finding the text too tricky to read, ask an adult to read it to you and share the book together.	1) What did Brer Rabbit ask Tiger? Why do you think he asked him this? (p.7) 2) " <b>Tiger couldn't believe his ears</b> ". What does the author mean by this? (p.8) 3) Who is the other person/animal that wasn't afraid of Tiger? (p.9) 4) Why did Brer Rabbit call the Tiger <b>cowardly</b> ? (p.9) 5) What are the two things Brer Elephant said the Tiger will do to him? (p.10) 6) Why do you think Brer Rabbit wants Brer Elephant's help? (p.11)
Session 3	<b>The Tricky Rabbit</b> <i>Retold by Walt Flood</i>	Please read Chapter 4, pages <b>12 to 17</b> independently or to an adult. If you are finding the text too tricky to read, ask an adult to read it to you and share the book together.	1) What did Tiger discover Brer Rabbit was famous for? 2) What does the word <b>bluffing</b> mean? Use it in a sentence. (p.12) 3) What happened in the forest when the elephant screamed? (p.13) 4) Why was Brer Rabbit a trickster? (p.15) 5) Do you think Tiger is gone for good? Why or why not?
Session 4	<b>The Tricky Rabbit</b> <i>Retold by Walt Flood</i>	Please read Chapter 5, pages <b>18 to 19</b> , independently or to an adult. Stop after page 19 and answer questions 1 and 2. Please read Chapter 6, <b>page 20 to 22</b> . Answer questions 3 to 6. If you are finding the text too tricky to read, ask an adult to read it to you and share the book together.	1) What did Lion say he was going to do to remind everyone he was in charge of the forest? (p.18) 2) Why did the animals run to the pond and check their reflections? (p.19) 3) On page 20, it says that <b>Lion was astonished to see Brer Rabbit</b> at his door. How was Lion feeling? 4) Describe what Brer Rabbit said was in the pond. (p21-22) 5) On page 22, Lion <i>nervously</i> said " <b>I'm not scared.</b> " Is he telling the truth? Explain your answer.

- 2) What was Brer Rabbit's plan? (p.24)
- 3) What did the Lion do to the pond beast? (p.26)
- 4) Write a sentence to explain why the lion was in a frenzy. (p.26)
- 5) How do you think the other animals felt when Brer Rabbit told them the news? (p.28)

## Mark Scheme

Day	Follow-Up Task Answers
Session 1	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Brer Rabbit enjoyed playing tricks and jokes on the animals in the forest.</li><li>2) The animals were terrified when Lion and Tiger moved into the forest because they were eating everything in their sight.</li><li>3) To stay safe, the animals didn't dare to walk around the forest or let their children play out.</li><li>4) Brer Rabbit felt bored and fed up, he wanted to play outside with his friends.</li><li>5) Any sentences using the word 'boredom' correctly.</li><li>6) So far we know that Brer Rabbit is a cheeky rabbit. He enjoys playing tricks on other animals and being outside.</li></ol>
Session 2	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Brer Rabbit asked Tiger if he wanted to fight him. I think he asked Tiger this because he was bored and wanted to trick him.</li><li>2) When the author wrote "<b>Tiger couldn't believe his ears</b>", he meant that Tiger was very shocked by what Brer Rabbit was saying.</li><li>3) The other person that wasn't afraid of Tiger was a hunter with a weapon that he saw in the forest.</li><li>4) Brer Rabbit called the Tiger <b>cowardly</b> because he was scared of what Brer Rabbit was saying to him and he backed away.</li><li>5) Brer Elephant said the Tiger will butter his toast with his brains and use his bones as toothpicks!</li><li>6) Brer Rabbit wanted Brer Elephant's help to trick the Tiger and scare him away from the forest.</li></ol>
Session 3	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Tiger discover Brer Rabbit was famous in the forest for his tricks and lies.</li><li>2) Bluffing means pretending/faking. Any sentences using the word correctly.</li><li>3) When the elephant screamed, a hundred trees fell over and every bird in the forest laid an egg.</li><li>4) Tiger knew Brer Rabbit was a trickster because the other animals had told him. He thought Brer Rabbit was tricking him with the elephant.</li><li>5) Children's own reasons as to why Tiger is gone for good or not.</li></ol>
Session 4	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) To show everyone he was boss, Lion said he was going to eat one juiciest, tastiest, young animal for breakfast every day.</li><li>2) The animals ran to the pond to check their reflections because they wanted to see how juicy and tasty they looked.</li><li>3) Lion was felt incredibly shocked to see Brer Rabbit at his door because he thought everyone was scared of him.</li><li>4) Brer Rabbit said there was a Pond Beast in the pond, which was twice the lion's size, with teeth twice as big and claws twice as sharp.</li><li>5) I don't think Lion is telling the truth and he is worried, as he nervously said to Brer Rabbit "I'm not scared."</li></ol>
Session 5	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) The Pond Beast was a reflection of Lion in the water.</li><li>2) Brer Rabbit's plan was to scare the Lion, by pretending there was a pond beast in the water. However, it was just a reflection of the Lion and Brer Rabbit hoped he wouldn't realise it was his reflection.</li><li>3) The Lion roared, scratched and swiped at the Pond Beast.</li><li>4) The Lion was in a frenzy because he didn't realised the Pond Beast was his reflection. So every time he swiped at the beast, it seemed that the beast was swiping back at the Lion. He didn't realise he was scratching himself.</li><li>5) I think that the other animals would have felt incredibly relieved and overjoyed to hear that the Tiger and Lion are gone.</li></ol>
