

Starter (10 minutes)		
Listen to Miss Ottley read the story African Animals ABC by Phillipa-Alys Browne. (If you do not have access to the internet, read the poem that is in the book in the table below.)

Main Teaching		
<p><u>Recap</u></p> <p>What is a noun? A noun is a word that is a person, place, or thing.</p> <p>What is a verb? A word used to describe an action, or occurrence. She <i>walks</i> to school.</p>		

Show the children how to write an alphabet verb poem based on insects.
 Start with a noun (name of an insect). Then add a verb (action or doing word).
 For example,



Army ants is a noun. March is a verb.
 Bumble bee is a noun. Buzz is a verb.
 Caterpillar is a noun. Crawls is a verb.

The aim is to fill in as many insects (nouns) and actions (verbs) as you can.

Independent Task

Create your own list of alphabet nouns and verbs for insects to create a poem.
 Try to write an example for every letter in the alphabet.

For example :
 Army ants march
 Bumble bees buzz
 Caterpillar crawls

Learning Review

Spot the Good Mistake

Army ants march
 Bumble bees are black and white
 Caterpillar crawls
 Dragonflies swim

Black and white are adjectives not verbs.
 Do dragon flies swim? This is not a good verb to use to describe this insect. Better alternatives are: *Dragonflies flutter* or *Dragonflies soar* or *Dragonflies hover*
