



Main Teaching		
<b>What is a suffix?</b> A <b>suffix</b> is a letter or group of letters that goes on the <b>end</b> of a word and <b>changes</b> the word's <b>meaning</b> . <b>What is a prefix?</b> Prefixes are a group of letters that change the meaning of a word when they are added to the start. Most prefixes mean a similar thing when they're added to different words. <b>What do all of these words have in common?</b> unhappy uncover unkind unable They all begin with the prefix 'un'. <b>What does the prefix 'un' mean?</b>		
unhappy	Not happy	
unkind	Not kind	
uncover	To take a cover off something	
It means 'not' or the opposite of something. <b>Can you add 'un' to the beginning of these words to make new ones?</b> <i>If you don't have access to the video use the pictures below. Cover the answers on the right side.</i>		
comfortable	uncomfortable	
certain	uncertain	
fair	unfair
