Main Teaching								
<p>At the start of every sentence is a capital letter. This is easy to remember because it is ALWAYS true.</p> <p>What are the letters that should really be at the beginning of these sentences? Write them on a piece of paper.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. every single snowflake is different. 2. your house is bigger than mine. 3. have you seen that new film about wizards? 4. get off that table before it breaks! <p>Every sentence also ends with one of three punctuation marks: an exclamation mark, a full stop or a question mark.</p>								

Full stops

Used for general sentences which state something.

e.g. Apples can be green or red.



Exclamation Marks

Used for exclamations, possibly sudden, or strong emotions such as shock, disgust, anger or happiness.


e.g. What a mess!




Question Marks

Used when a sentence is asking something and has an answer.

e.g. Can I have some pudding?
