




## Y1 English Distance Teaching and Learning

<b>Lesson 3</b>		
<b>Learning Intention:</b> WALT: discuss a wide range of poems.	<b>Key Vocabulary:</b> Question Answer	<b>What you will need:</b> Pencil and paper
<b>Starter</b>		
<b><u>Weightlessness</u></b> A path leading down and the wind on your face A backpack to throw and your shoes to unlace The crunch of the sand as it sticks to your toes Like bright yellow sugar, so golden it glows And the crash of the waves and the wind in your hair And your friends' piercing shrieks - let's go in. Do we dare? <b>Main Teaching</b>		
Read the poem. <p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Why are My Tears so Salty?</u></b> By Celia Warren Why are my tears so salty? <i>You must have swallowed the sea.</i> Why are my legs so heavy? <i>To stop you floating free.</i> Why do I feel as empty as a shell that's prised apart? <i>Because, when you left the sandy shore, you left a bit of your heart.</i></p> Discuss the words and phrases with the children. <b>This is a question and answer poem.</b> How is this poem different to other poems we have read? <b>It is a question and answer poem.</b> Does it rhyme? Do all poems have to rhyme? <b>No not all poems have to rhyme. This poem has some rhyme throughout.</b>		

Look at the picture to help you think of answers to the questions.



Model for the children how to answer the first two questions.
