Main Teaching		
A verb is a word used to describe an action, state or occurrence. Verbs can be used to describe an action (doing something). For example, like the word 'jumping' in this sentence: The rabbit was <u>jumping</u> in the field. Verbs can be used to describe a state (being or feeling something). For example, the word 'likes' here: The monster <u>likes</u> rollercoasters. Verbs can also be used to describe an occurrence (something happening). For example, the word 'became' in this sentence: The caterpillar <u>became</u> a butterfly. When writing, make sure every sentence includes a verb. When you are writing, the verbs you use show if the events have already happened, are happening now or will happen in the future.

The **past tense** is used for things that have already happened. Past tense verbs often end in **ed** but not always.

For example: I walked to the shop.

The **present tense** is used when something is happening now or when something happens regularly.

For example: I am walking to the shop.

The **future tense** is used to talk about things that haven't happened yet.

For example: I will walk to the shop.

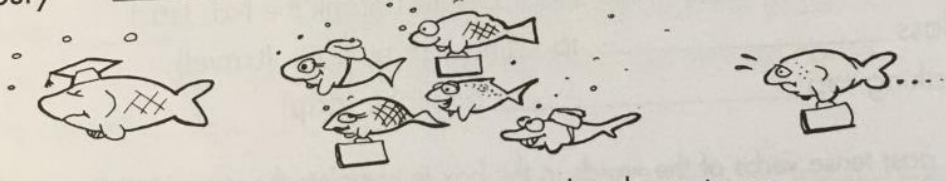

ed or d is usually added when a verb is changed into the past tense. ed is added to most verbs. d is added to verbs ending in e.



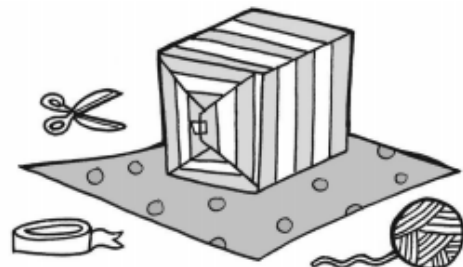
