
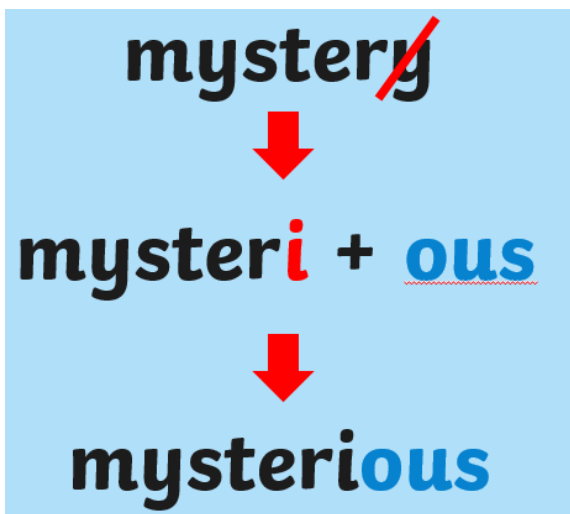

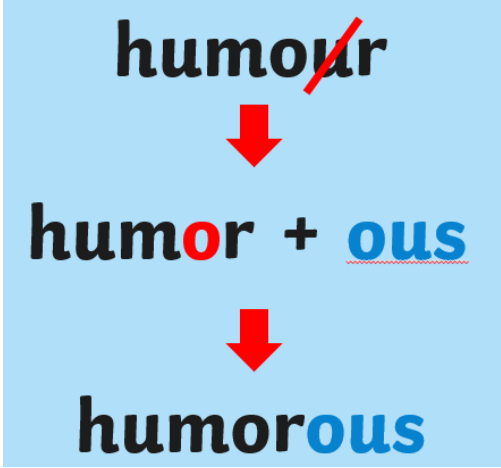

Our other group of words all have the suffix –ous added to a root word that ends in ‘our’.

Root word	Suffix	Spelling word
rigour	- <u>ous</u>	rigor ous
vigour	- <u>ous</u>	vigor ous

This time the ‘u’ is removed from the ‘our’ and then the suffix is added
