

Some further examples of words containing the prefix **de**: deactivate, defuse, deface, de-escalate, de-ice, debrief, declutter, decompose, decongest, deflate, defrost, deforestation, defuse, dehydrate, demotivate.

Some further examples of words containing the prefix **dis**: disarm, disappoint, disable, disqualify, disconnect, disobey, disbelieve, discount, disorder, discourage, discover, disgraceful, disrespectful, disincline, disinfect, dislike, disrepair, dissatisfied.

Some further examples of words containing the prefix **mis**: misguide, miscalculate, misconduct, misfire, misfit, misfortune, mismanagement, misinform, misguide, misjudge.
