Monday	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Robinson's parents were completely against him going to sea. His dad thought they would never see him again.2) We know Robinson was a determined person because it says, 'I was going, no matter what anyone said.'3) 'Smashed' is the verb that shows us how the wave hit the boat.4) Robin's wished he had not gone to sea firstly when he is seasick and then again, when the hurricane hits the boat.5) 'Frantically', shows us the men were acting in a distraught way because they were frightened.

Wednesday	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Robinson had been on the island for 9 months when he became sick.2) His canoe was useless because he had made it in the woods and it was far too heavy for him to drag it to the sea.3) During his first 20 years, Robinson missed the company of other people the most.4) He was afraid when he first saw the footprint as he realised there was someone else on his island and he didn't know if they were friendly or not.5) The term for a person that eats another person is a cannibal.

Friday	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1) The captain asks Robinson if he is a man, angle or beast because he is surprised to see someone living on the island and that he thinks he might be dreaming.2) Robinson felt proud of his home. This is because he had spent years making it into a home all by himself and had not shown it to anyone else, apart from Friday, before.3) The Captain fires seven shots to show Crusoe that he is back in control of the ship.4) Crusoe feels, happy, excited and a little bit sad about leaving his island.5) The story is based on Alexander Selkirk who live on a deserted island in 1704 for more than 4 years.
