Session 1	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) The Spiny Dogfish Shark is a member of the Squalidae family. 2) It grows to a length of 1.21 metres. 3) Spiny Dogfish Sharks are caught and used as food, fertilizer, and pet food by humans. 4) Female Spiny Dogfish Sharks don't begin to reproduce until they are about 20 years old. 5) Spiny Dogfish Sharks may live to be more than 70 years old. 6) The Spiny Dogfish Sharks get their name from the spine that sticks out from each dorsal fin. They were also given this name because they hunt in packs the way dogs do.

Session 3	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Sharks have lived in the world's oceans for more than 400 million years. 2) Humans pose the greatest threat to the continued existence of sharks and rays. 3) Many more people have died from bee stings and car crashes than from shark attacks. 4) 100 million sharks and rays are killed by humans each year. 5) Scientists believe that shark numbers have declined by 80 per cent. 6) Sharks are killed for sport, die when caught in fishing nets and when they are finned.
