<p>As we start our 'Plants' topic, we'd like you to do two drawings of a piece of fruit or a vegetable. Your first drawing should be the whole piece (in colour if you can). For your second drawing, please ask an adult to cut the fruit/veg in half. Then get really close, imagine that you are a very tiny person and draw what you can see. Does it have hairs? Or little droplets of juice? Or bumps? Try and colour your picture carefully.</p>  <p><u>Challenge!</u> Can you write a list of at least seven adjectives or phrases to describe what the close-up view looks like? Can you describe the smell? Perhaps compare it to something else or write what it reminds you of.</p> <p>Parent/carer signature and date:</p>	<p>We are looking at what seeds need to grow and will be watching what happens over the next three weeks. If you are currently at school, you will be given three seeds, a freezer bag, a 'diary' recording sheet and instructions. <i>(If you are working at home, there will be a pack ready for you when you return to school in March.)</i> Once you have prepared your investigation, please fill in a section of your bean diary once a week for 3 weeks, by then your bean should be big enough to put into soil and plant outside.</p> <div data-bbox="837 663 1099 1070" data-label="Form"> <p align="center">My Bean in a Bag Diary</p> <p>Today the date is: _____</p> <p>and my bean looks like this:</p> <div style="border: 1px solid black; height: 100px; width: 100%;"></div> </div> <p><u>Challenge!</u> Can you plant each bean in a different place (dark + warm, light + warm, light + cold)? Can you predict which one will grow better?</p> <p>Parent/care signature and date:</p>	<p>This half term, we are going to be looking at friendship in PSHE. Sometimes in friendships, conflicts happen. A conflict is a disagreement or an argument. We would like you to come up with four strategies you think you could use to resolve a conflict between you and a friend. Try to think of four things you could do before telling an adult.
