Create a mind map with at least seven things that you can think of to describe a good friend. To help you, think about the following questions: What makes a good friend? Why is it important to have friends in our lives and to be a good friend? We have thought about how fire safety is different today than it was 350 years ago. Create a poster that will help teach people what to do in case of a fire. You can include a title, bullet points, interesting facts, instructions and pictures. Fire safety education at home London Fire Brigade (london-fire.gov.uk) Challenge! What is your fire plan at home? What equipment do you have in your home that keeps you safe from fires? Talk to your parents and write down 3 things you do to keep safe at home.
