## Task Two

Think about one of the Traditional Tales we have been learning about. You could choose Goldilocks and the Three Beers, Little Red Riding Hood, The Three Little Pigs or Jack and the Beanstalk. Retell the story and upload a video on Tapestry.

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## Task Three

It is important to work on our gross motor skills to help develop healthy bodies and social and emotional well-being. Practise these moves, and ask an adult to put a photo on Tapestry. *Crab walking:* Sit on your bottom, place hands on the floor behind you, push up and start moving. Crab walk to the bathroom to brush their teeth, crab walk to the door to get your shoes, crab walk ANYWHERE.

The Egg: Lie on your back, curl head and legs up into a ball, with arms crossed in front of chest. Start with 5 seconds and work your way up to 20 seconds. When your skills improve, you can pretend to be a 'jellybean' and can rock from side to side and back and forwards.





#### Challenge!

Create an obstacle course you can manoeuvre through. Think about how you can balance, move, and roll.
