

<p><u>English</u></p> <p>We will be linking English to our topics where possible and learning to write in a range of different styles including narrative, fables, poetry and non-chronological reports. We will revise vowel digraphs and Key Stage 1 common exception words as well as adding suffixes and thinking about how to use this knowledge when reading and writing. We will also continue to develop cursive handwriting skills, aiming to be writing in pen and begin to explore the grammatical terms that we need to know in Year 3.</p>	<p><u>Maths</u></p> <p>We begin by securing our understanding of place value in 3-digit numbers, using practical materials to demonstrate our understanding of the value of Hundreds, Tens and Ones. We will then go on to investigating mental and written addition and subtraction methods. In 5 for 5 sessions, we will continue to improve our arithmetic and reasoning skills. We encourage regular TTRS practise in preparation for next year's Multiplication check. We will be securing the 2, 5 and 10 and learning the 3,4 and 8 timetables.</p>	<p><u>Science</u></p> <p>Our topic for the first half term is 'Animals including humans-Muscles and Bones'. The children will learn to identify the purpose of the skeleton and identify bones and muscles and how they work. We will also look at vertebrates and invertebrates. After half term our topic is 'Rocks'. We will be finding out about the features of rocks, grouping them and discovering how fossils are formed. Experimental and investigative work will focus on making observations, measurements and comparisons, identifying similarities and differences and sorting accordingly, choosing the correct equipment and using secondary sources for research.</p>
